Dear Student:

Since 1986, the Delaware Community Foundation has been connecting people who care with the causes they care about. We do this by helping individuals and organizations establish charitable funds and award charitable grants. Many of our donors who care about education choose to create scholarship funds to help with rising education costs and provide opportunities for individuals like you.

This year, the Delaware Community Foundation will be using an online application system. Visit our scholarship page at www.delcf.org/scholarships and click on the application link. You can apply for the majority of our scholarships by completing the single application online.

To use the Delaware Community Foundation online application, you will be required to create an account using your email address. After you answer a series of questions, the system will submit your completed application to all the scholarships you are eligible for. You may be eligible for more than one scholarship. There is no cap on the number of awards or amount you can receive.

You will find a complete listing of the scholarships and their criteria in this *Delaware Community Foundation Scholarship Compendium, Scholarships to be Awarded for the 2016-2017 School Year*.

This year the booklet is separated into two parts: the first part lists scholarships that require an applicant complete the Delaware Community Foundation online application. The scholarships in the second part do not use the online application. Instructions for accessing or obtaining those applications are listed for those individual scholarships.

The Delaware Community Foundation online application s must be completed and submitted no later than **March 15, 2016** to be considered for a scholarships. An application must have all sections completed and all supporting documents provided to be considered complete. Partially completed application will not be considered for a scholarship. Please check the submission requirements for those scholarships not using the online application.

Our goal through the scholarship program at the Delaware Community Foundation is to provide funding to as many eligible students as possible. Please carefully review our *Compendium*; we believe it will be time well spent. Important Dates and Deadlines for Scholarship Applicants

October

- Scholarship applications become available online.
- Scholarship compendium is mailed to schools and is available online.

January–February

- Complete FAFSA form.
- Complete and submit the Delaware Community Foundation’s scholarship application.

March 15

- Applications are due.

March 15 – May 5

- Scholarship Committee meets to make selections.

May 25–June 30

- Award notifications are sent to students. Each student will receive an award/denial notification.
- Award notice will provide instructions required to obtain funding, such as acceptance letters to schools or other proof of enrollment.

July 1–July 30

- Checks are mailed to schools.

Achievement Scholarship for Students with a History of Chronic Illness Fund

DEADLINE: March 15

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must have experienced a health-related issue – not necessarily a chronic illness – documented by a physician, which lasted at least six months and impaired the individual’s ability to pursue his or her education.
- Graduating seniors or former graduates of any high school in the State of Delaware
- Preference will be given to those enrolled in the First State School or any of its branches prior to or at the time the health-related issue occurred
- Past awardees are eligible to apply.
- Documentation will need to be provided by your treating physician documenting the illness and its impact on your ability to attend school.
- A statement will be required from the applicant about the experience and struggles dealing with their illness and what they have had to overcome
